Hello Family. I pray all is well with you and your family. As we engage in this Lenten season, we have several exciting activities to participate in and fellowship. We have two more Wednesday Worship Experiences for Lent on April 6 and 13. On the last evening of the Worship Experience we will be taking up an offering for the Preacher's Aid Society (<a href="https://www.preachersaid.org/what-we-do">https://www.preachersaid.org/what-we-do</a>). Also, we are having a joint Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Service (April 14 &15) with Emmanuel Lutheran starting at 6:30 pm on both evenings. Plus, every morning during Lent we will have a prayer and devotional time on Facebook Live with Pastor Paul starting at 7:30 am. Also, we will be meeting on April 15 and 22 (Fridays) for our prayer service at 7 pm in-person and on Zoom.

I am so excited to share a special event with you. Below is a brief write up of the event that we have partnered with Dr. Grace Hampton. We are looking to have seasoned saints and young people engage in two intergenerational conversations at Albright-Bethune on April 8 and 29 at 7 pm. I pray that you are able to join us and are able to bring some young and seasoned saints to join the conversations.

Racism Revealed: Then vs Now is the focus for the first conversation on April 8. The conversation is free and open to the public. The doors to our church will open at 6:30p.m. This will be an evening of intergenerational conversation woven together by history as seen through fabric, poetry, and music. This will be a gathering of community, a celebration of diversity, and a discussion of common interests and shared experiences. You will learn the meaning, value, and lessons of traditional Adinkra Symbols and Kente Cloth as the lens to view history. You can listen to "Penn State W.O.R.D.S." students share an offering of art through their poetry. Then you can discuss with those around you a set of guided questions and share in a caring open forum. Light snacks and drinks will be served afterwards.

**Social Justice: We Shall Overcome, But How?** will be the focus for the conversation on April 29 that is also free and open to the public. This will be another gathering of community, a celebration of diversity, and a discussion of common interests and shared experiences. You can also listen to Essence of Joy and Dr. Anthony Leach sharing an offering of music through songs and spirituals of the African and African American tradition focused on social justice. - Nothing But Nets Since 2006, the UMC has been fighting malaria as a founding partner of a group called *Nothing But Nets*. The UMC, the United Nations Foundation, and various partners have built this grassroots movement to end malaria and over 13 million bed nets have been sent to families in Africa. Just \$10 buys a bed net, distributes it to a family, and provides education on how to use it. The partners have raised over \$70 million. - Mother's Day Greece gave birth to Mother's Day, but the mother of Mother's Day in the US was Ann Marie Reeves Jarvis, the wife of a West Virginia Methodist pastor. Her daughter, Anna, led a campaign to have Mother's Day become a national holiday. Anna heard her mother express hope that a memorial would be established for mothers, living and dead. After her father's death in 1902, Anna, her mother, and sister moved to Philadelphia. After Ann's death in 1905, Anna began a drive to fulfill her mother's wish. On May 10, 1908, a program was held at Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton and in Philadelphia, launching a memorial day for mothers. The church later observed Mother's Day on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday each year making Andrews the mother church of Mother's Day. The church, no longer an active Methodist congregation, was incorporated as an international shrine in 1962. Mother's Day will be celebrated in 2022 on May 8 (From UM News Service).
- Ascension Day Did you know that, as promised, Jesus appeared to His disciples 40 days after his crucifixion? Christians traditionally celebrate His ascension into heaven on the 40<sup>th</sup> day of Easter (May 26 in 2022). This event is followed by the Day of Pentecost to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit in whose power this happens.
