- Vacation Bible School From July 19-22, our congregation participated in a joint Vacation Bible School (VBS) with Park Forest Village UMC. The VBS program was held on the decorated lawn of Park Forest from 5:30-8:10 pm. The program included Bible adventures, songs, art, science, games, and food. - Marriage Congratulations to Shaun Donohue and Caroline Rublein, two of our worshippers, who were married in May. They traveled to Hawaii in July and Shaun was introduced to Caroline's maternal grandparents, aunts, and uncles who live in Hawaii. Best wishes for a long, and successful marriage.

• **Bsa camping experiences** - This summer several Albright-Bethune members and worshippers participated in three challenging camping experiences. Please take the time to ask them about their experiences and to offer congratulations.

First, Wilderness Camp was held immediately after the end of school term. BSA Troops 328 and 380 camped along a remote portion of the west branch of the Susquehanna River for a week, having backpacked in and out along ridges and valleys of the Allegheny Mountains. They cooked all of their own meals over open fires, completed several strenuous hikes, performed some conservation work on the pristine Yost Creek, and earned several merit badges including Wilderness Survival and Orienteering. Scoutmaster JoDee Dyreson accompanied several of our young worshipers including Zan D., Katie D., and Taylor B. Eagle Scouts Braden Dyreson and McClane Dyreson backpacked in for the last night to help with the strenuous hike out on the last day.

Second, Custaloga Town Scout Camp near Erie hosted a week-long resident camp June 27-July 3 in which Scouts camped in traditional canvas tents, rock climbed and rappelled from an extremely high tower, and earned boating, art, archery, and shooting merit badges amongst several others. **Braden** and **Zan** earned Climb On adult supervision-climbing certification; **Zan** completed the challenging BSA Mile Swim; **Zan** and **Katie** trained as BSA Lifeguards; **Taylor**, **Zan**, and **Katie** earned the Swimming and Lifesaving merit badges, and **Katie** won the campwide Best Shooter Award for her small-bore rifle shooting. All of the Scouts and leaders thoroughly enjoyed their week at camp.

Third, from July 9-22 as part of BSA Troops 328 and 380, **Taylor**, **Braden**, **Zan**, and **Katie** backpacked in the backcountry Maroon Bells of the Colorado Rockies for eight days, hiking 50+ miles and reaching four 12,000+-foot mountain passes. They visited Pike's Peak, Garden of the Gods, and the U.S. Air Force Academy. These Scouts also zip-lined over several Rocky Mountain canyons and white-water rafted on the Arkansas River through the Royal Gorge.

- Equipping Vital Congregations (EVC) Effective July 1, Pastor McReynolds became the fulltime pastor of Albright-Bethune. This change means that our church is no longer yoked with Park Forest UMC. Through the Equipping Vital Congregations (EVC) program, our Susquehanna Conference and State College District are providing resources and support that should enable our congregation to experience a growth mode. On March 30, District Superintendent Brenda Leigey held a special charge conference where our congregation voted to support this new arrangement. See Pastor McReynolds or Jackie Peagler, our Administrative Council Chair, if you have questions about the EVC program. The key objectives of the EVC program include the following:
 - Help the church move toward greater vitality in its outreach, mission and ministry in the community.
 - Intentional focus on reaching new, younger and more diverse people to grow the Beloved Community.
 - Pastor and laity working together.
 - Two-year commitment between the church and EVC.
 - Accountability through monthly coaching contacts, quarterly stakeholder meetings and monthly updates to the EVC Office.
 - Funding from EVC will continue, for two years, as long as progress toward agreed upon goals is being made.
 - Funding from EVC may be extended if progress is made AND funds are available.

- Each One, Bring One! Many individuals will soon move to the area when classes start at Penn State and in the schools. Some individuals will seek a church home to have a fulfilling religious experience. Take the time to share your worship experiences and then bring one of these individuals into our church. Next, nurture and keep that person involved. Don't underestimate the impact that you can have by bringing one new person into our congregation. See Pastor McReynolds for ideas that you can share with an un-churched person.
