- Death Mrs. Azalea Stevenson, a long-term member and worshipper, died on July 11 in Clarion. On July 7, she celebrated her 98<sup>th</sup> birthday. Azalea and her beloved husband (Albert) moved to State College after Hurricane Katrina destroyed their home of almost 60 years and most of their possessions in 2005. Even with this disappointment, they remained positive and upbeat. They became very active members of the State College community for as long as their health allowed. Mrs. Stevenson was a gifted singer who occasionally delivered excellent solos during our worship service. They recently moved to Clarion to be in a facility closer to their son, Rod. Details will be provided when a memorial service is scheduled.
- ALBRIGHT-BETHUNE COOKS Discussions during our congregation's Wednesday night Zoom meeting have led to a new initiative for our church. We will expand our Men Who Cook concept and create a virtual Albright-Bethune Cooks. The concept is patterned after what Dylan Dreyer uses on the *Today Show* to teach her son (Cal) how to cook. - DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT KILLED Many are still feeling shock and grief after the Rev. Autura Eason-Williams, a United Methodist district superintendent, was shot and killed in an apparent carjacking. Memphis, TN, police responded to gunfire the afternoon of July 18 and found Eason-Williams shot outside her home. She was pronounced deceased at the hospital. The police have since charged a 15-year-old boy with murder in the fatal shooting and a 16-year-old boy with theft. Eason-Williams, 52, was a beloved leader in the legacy Memphis Conference and what is now the Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference. She also was the wife of Darrell Eason-Williams and mother of four children (By Heather Hahn, UM News).
- Vacation Bible School Thanks to everyone who participated in Vacation Bible School at Park Forest Village UMC from July 18-21. Park Forest again invited our congregation to participate its Bible School. This year's theme was Discovery on Adventure Island.
- Churches Sue to Leave UMC More than 100 churches have filed a lawsuit against the Florida UMC Conference seeking to leave The UMC with property without a hefty exit payment. Since the 18<sup>th</sup> century, The UMC and its predecessors have maintained a trust clause which states that all church property is held in trust for the entire denomination. Annual conferences, regional bodies containing multiple congregations and other ministries, typically are the enforcers of the trust clause. The <a href="Lawsuit">Lawsuit</a> filed by 106 churches in Bradford County Court asks the court to rule the trust clause "invalid on its face" or enable the congregations to revoke the trust so the churches can withdraw with their buildings. The underlying dispute is about same-sex marriage and the ordination of LGBTQ clergy (By Heather Hahn, | UM News).
- **Grant to Upgrade Bathrooms** A United Methodist Foundation grant proposal that **Cathy Bowen** wrote has been funded for \$25,000 to support the remodeling of our basement social hall men's and women's restrooms. We will update them and make them accessible to individuals with physical limitations. A committee is seeking estimates from contractors and will appreciate suggestions. Before the work begins, plans will be shared with the congregation. The grant proposal included a matching amount (i.e., cost sharing) of funds from past and present members and attendees.
