• **R**ACIAL ETHNIC SUMMIT - The 2023 Racial Ethnic Summit will be held from noon on September 22 through lunch on September 24 at the Seven Springs Mountain Resort in Somerset County. Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi and Bishop Sandra Steiner Ball are cohosting this event with the UMC's Strengthening the Black Church for the 21st Century. In addition to clergy, the bishops have invited the SPRC chair, Administrative Board/Church Council chair, and Lay Leader from each racial-ethnic congregation or church served by a racial-ethnic pastor. **Pastor McReynolds**, **Jackie Peagler** as the chair of our Administrative Council and our Pastor-Parish Relations Committee, and **Blannie Bowen** as Lay Leader will attend to represent our congregation. • **EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT** - Katie Dyreson has designed an Eagle Scout project to donate clothing to Ukraine. Katie is seeking monetary support to help package and transport clothing for those in need in Ukraine. You can donate with checks, online, and cash. • Food WASTE - The food industry around the world is facing the problem that more food is produced or served than is actually consumed. UMC related Africa University in Zimbabwe has developed a solution to this problem through the creation of a digital platform that allows students to place daily meal orders for breakfast, lunch, or dinner by choosing from the set menu for the day. These orders are then stored in a database that the Bonaventure Ndorimana Dining Hall uses to guide how much food is cooked per service, assess what meals are best sellers, and in the long term, informs the purchasing that the dining hall makes using consumer buying and consumption trends over time. What makes this innovation even more impressive is that it was built mainly by Africa University students and graduate trainees who conducted lengthy research of the problem, identified bottle necks in food service delivery on the campus, and developed a home-grown solution that produces data so decisions can be made that bring efficiencies in purchasing, waste reduction, and service delivery (Adapted from a *Story by Juliet Sithole*, African University News - https://aunews.africau.edu/?p=2822).

• **P**LANNING FOR FINANCIAL LIFE EVENTS PROGRAM - Congratulations to **Cathy Bowen** who has received a small grant (\$600) to fund a program entitled "*Planning for Probable Financial Life Events*" from the United Methodist Foundation. The plan is to deliver a program this fall over a series of meetings. The goal of the project is to provide a safe environment for women to learn about and be encouraged to take steps to help them manage financial matters if they face one of the following events: (1) managing the financial aspects of life alone, (2) assisting an aging parent, or (3) managing financial matters of a deceased family member. Cathy will provide more details and specifics about the program after they are confirmed.

• Unc DISAFFILIATIONS - The UM News indicates that 6,182 church disaffiliations in the US have been approved by UMC annual conferences. This total includes 148 churches in our Susquehanna Conference that have left the UMC. Since the church law took effect, about 20% of U.S. churches have received the required approvals to disaffiliate. But that policy - the Book of Discipline's Paragraph 2553 - only applies in the U.S. and is set to expire at the end of the year. The 6,182 total comes from a UM News review of annual conference reports, publicly available journals, and reports of special annual conference sessions held in 2022 and this year. The General Council on Finance and Administration, the UMC's finance agency, is collecting the official data on disaffiliations and church closures. But the finance agency's count of disaffiliations lags behind UM News' data because it must wait for annual conferences to submit official reports (From UM News - https://www.umnews.org/en/news/disaffiliations-approved-by-annual-conferences).
