- Souper Bowl Sunday If you watch the Super Bowl on February 13, think about sharing your snacks. In 1993, a single prayer led a senior high school youth group in Columbia, SC, to create a simple, yet powerful idea to fight hunger and poverty in their city. The Souper Bowl of Caring calls youth to action. And individuals, civic organizations, and schools are making a difference through this movement. - God's Trombones A production of James Weldon Johnson's God's Trombones with Essence 2 Ltd will be presented on February 25 at 7 pm at Good Shepherd Catholic Church in Port Matilda. No admission is required but donations will be accepted. The donations will benefit the PA Innocence Project. Masks are required.
- Grants To Local Agencies Albright-Bethune received \$3,500 in unsolicited grant funds from the Multi-Ethnic Center of the Northeastern Jurisdiction of the UMC. According to our former Susquehanna Conference Bishop Jeremiah Park, the purpose of this Center is to help Conferences in the Jurisdiction deal with racism and to assist racial, ethnic, and multicultural congregations to be in ministry especially during the COVID pandemic. The Center is funded in part by shares of ministry to the Jurisdiction. Our Administrative Council decided to use the funds to give \$500 grants to each of seven local agencies and organizations to assist with their programming. The grants were made to (1) Interfaith Missions, (2) the Youth Services Bureau, (3) Centre Volunteers in Medicine, (4) the State College Food Bank, (5) Strawberry Fields, (6) Centre Safe, and (7) Out of the Cold.

- PROGRAM GRADUATE Congratulations to Keisha Johnson who recently completed the Advanced Management Program at the University of Pennsylvania. After seven months, Keisha completed her final presentation and class session. The program included various types of assessment and mentoring. - Weaving Wisdom Project Albright-Bethune has agreed to partner with Grace Hampton on a community-based project that seeks to expand interactions across the generations. Dr. Hampton is a retired Penn State administrator and professor who is one of only 15 individuals who have been selected to receive the Gen2Gen Innovation Fellowship for innovators who are bridging generational divides. Each year, the Encore Foundation selects practical visionaries who have new ideas for putting generational connection and collaboration front and center in ways that benefit all ages. Dr. Hampton is the Co-founder of the Weaving Wisdom: Fabrics and The Stories They Tell project which seeks to enrich relationships between generations and cultures through traditional fabric arts. She will use her \$10,000 fellowship to support "Weaving Wisdom" which is a community-focused project designed to use the communicative power of the arts to increase communication between older adults and younger individuals. The project uses Kente and Adinkra cloths, American quilts, and basketry to show how cultural values, social norms, heritage, and the history of nations, communities, and families can be transmitted between generations. The specifics of Albright-Bethune's involvement will be communicated when they are finalized. See Pastor Paul if you have questions about this partnership.
