- HUMAN RELATIONS DAY The UMC will celebrate Human Relations Day on January 15, and how will you help celebrate this important day? Turn on the news or drive around the outskirts of your town and you will find what Jesus called "the least of these." Those living in the margins of society, struggling to survive. People like:
  - An immigrant teenager in Texas' poorest county, being recruited by a local gang;
  - · A father struggling for sobriety in Little Rock, Arkansas; and
  - An Oklahoma woman recently released from incarceration looking for work.

Over and over Jesus served and embraced people like these. And that's what we want to model as the people of the UMC. To continue the ministry of Jesus, the UMC established Human Relations Day as a Special Sunday and asks churches to help all of God's children realize their potential. - **UMC SCHOLARSHIPS & LOANS** United Methodist Church high school seniors and those enrolled in college who are also active in their church and/or in the conference may apply for a Fall 2023 scholarship offered through the United Methodist General Board of Higher Education and Ministry. Students must <u>apply online</u> between **December 15–March 30** at <a href="https://www.gbhem.org/loans-and-scholarships/scholarships">https://www.gbhem.org/loans-and-scholarships/scholarships</a>. Student loans are also available at low interest rates (with a credit worthy co-signer). Funds for these scholarships come from offerings taken on United Methodist Student Day, World Communion Sunday, and Native American Sunday. Please share this information with students who qualify for this support.
- Church Disaffiliations Much is in flux in The United Methodist Church as 2022 came to a close. What's clear is that the denomination's long, gradual numerical decline in the U.S. has accelerated due to local church disaffiliations. The UMC is experiencing a separation after decades of internal division about the role of LGBTQ people in church life. Thus far, slightly over 2,000 churches in the U.S. have cleared the necessary hurdles under church law to leave the denomination with property. That translates to about 6.6% of U.S. congregations withdrawing since 2019 when the church's disaffiliation provision took effect. Almost 1,700 of the disaffiliations are in the Southeastern and South Central UMC jurisdictions. Many of the congregations that have left are small, but the denomination also has seen the departure of some megachurches. The withdrawals still leave more than 28,500 United Methodist congregations in the U.S. (From UM News Article by Heather Hahn and Sam Hodges).

- Auw Scholarships The AAUW State College Undergraduate Scholarships for Centre County Women application process is now open. AAUW will select four recipients for scholarships that range from \$3,000-\$7,000 depending on the financial need and circumstances of the recipients. Female adult learners enrolled for the 2023-24 academic year are encouraged to apply.
