- Award Michelle Torregano recently received the Dr. Caryl J. Sheffield Award of Teaching and Mentoring during the California University of Pennsylvania's Hip Hop Conference. Michelle was also a panelist on a session about Critical Race Theory. Congratulations on the award. We are proud of your accomplishments. Michelle is a professor at California and has been associated with our congregation since she was a graduate student at Penn State.

- Supreme Court Ruling United Methodists with were alternately stunned and satisfied after the Supreme Court ruled that Roe v. Wade would no longer be the law of the land. The Court released the 5-3-1 opinion on June 24, but a leaked version of the ruling in May had already made the likely decision apparent. Justice Samuel Alito wrote the majority opinion. The Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision, which overturns the landmark Roe v. Wade ruling the high court made in 1973, gives the go-ahead to states to formulate their own policies on abortion. Some have already done so in anticipation of the ruling. Texas last year effectively outlawed abortion after the sixth week of pregnancy and allows almost any private citizen to sue anyone who helps a pregnant women terminate her pregnancy (From UM News, By Jim Patterson).
- AFRICA UNIVERSITY GRADUATION On June 11, the academic achievements of 712 graduates from 18 African countries were recognized as they garnered degrees and top honors at Africa University's 28th graduation ceremony. The event, held at the main campus in Mutare, focused on the theme, "Celebrating 30 Years of Excellence and Leadership Transformation in Africa." The class represented the following nations: Angola, Botswana, Burundi, Congo, Côte d'Ivoire, Eswatini, Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Malawi, Mozambique, Nigeria, Rwanda, South Africa, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Africa University is a UMC related institution located in Zimbabwe (From UM News).
- Grant to Upgrade Bathrooms A United Methodist Foundation grant proposal written by Cathy Bowen and submitted for funding has been approved. Rev. Edward Bailey informed Albright-Bethune on May 26 that this grant proposal would be fully funded in the amount of \$25,000. The grant monies will be used to remodel our basement social hall men's and women's restrooms. We will update them and make them accessible to individuals with physical limitations. A committee is seeking estimates from contractors and would appreciate suggestions. Before the work begins, plans will be shared with the congregation. The grant proposal included a matching amount (i.e., cost sharing) of funds from past and present members and attendees. - Boy Scouts & The UMC The UMC will continue to partner with the Boy Scouts of America, but in a new relationship that should lighten the load for local churches. That's a message denomination leaders are working to get across after a difficult two years that has included the BSA's child sex abuse-related bankruptcy proceeding and the pandemic. The practice of local churches serving as chartering organizations for Scouting groups will disappear. Instead, churches will have the option of entering into an affiliation agreement. Essentially, they will be promising to provide space and lots of support to Scouting groups, but supervisory responsibility will rest with local BSA Councils. The UMC and predecessor denominations have been a partner to the BSA for more than 100 years. Many local churches have not only been the headquarters for Scouting troops and packs, but also have recruited and screened adult leaders. In May 2022, about 6,600 Scouting units were chartered by UM churches in the US. However, in 2020, over 10,000 were chartered. The UMC remains the largest partner of BSA programs (From Article by Sam Hodges, UM News).
