• WESLEY'S BIRTHDAY - As John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, grew older, on his birthday he often commented how he was still in good health because God had blessed him. His birthday reflections give us a glimpse into how he viewed his life, health, and ministry. United Methodists around the globe celebrate Wesley's birthday on June 28.

• **F**ATHER'S DAY – We will celebrate Father's Day on June 20. In 1909, Mrs. Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, WA, proposed the idea of the "*Father's Day*" to honor her father, William Smart. Mr. Smart, a Civil War veteran, raised his six children by himself on a farm after his wife died in childbirth with their 6th child. The idea came when she heard a sermon about the merits of setting aside a day to honor one's mother. It gave her the idea to petition for a day to honor fathers and, in particular, her own father. With support from the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA, her efforts paid off. On June 19, 1910, the first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day, but it was not until 1966 when President Lyndon Johnson signed a proclamation declaring the 3rd Sunday of June as Father's Day. This day has become a time to not only honor your father, but all men who act as father figures. Stepfathers, uncles, grandfathers, and adult male friends are all honored on Father's Day. • **G**ENIUS AWARD - Marcinia Johnson, a sophomore at UMC affiliated Bennett College in Greensboro, NC, and a member of St. Mark's UMC in Charlotte, has been selected as a 2021 OZY Genius Award Winner for her "Anti-gentrification low-income homes for seniors" initiative. Marcinia is one of 10 recipients of the prestigious award. Previous winners include National Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman. Inspired by the friends of the late Harper Lee, who pooled their money to provide Lee with the gift of a year free from work to write what would become the esteemed novel, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, the OZY Genius Awards provide visionary college students the means to turn their vision into reality. Each winner receives \$10,000 and a mentor to launch their project and begin changing the world. Johnson also serves as a Lina H. McCord intern for the Black College Fund and received the prestigious Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship (From Western North Carolina UMC Conference News).

• **FINANCE CORNER** - Each month the amount our church collects via offerings is posted in this section of the newsletter. Our May collections totaled \$15,166.75. Tax News Related to Charitable Giving

Good news for married charitable givers who do not itemize deductions on federal tax returns. For the 2021 tax year, married couples can deduct \$600 for charitable giving when using the standard deduction. This is an increase of \$300 as the maximum for 2020 was \$300 regardless of filing status (single, married filing jointly, or head of household).

AmazonSmile

Albright-Bethune is a recognized charity with the AmazonSmile Foundation. If you make purchases using Amazon, you can also benefit Albright-Bethune by designating it as your charity of choice through Amazon Smile. All you need to do is use the AmazonSmile link when making a purchase. (The products and prices are the same. All AmazonSmile does is give you a voice in how Amazon distributes its charitable donations). Each time a customer makes a purchase using AmazonSmile, a portion of eligible items purchased will generate a 0.5% donation for the charity selected. Have a class outside, take a hike or picnic, or pick-up litter in a park or along a roadside. Try a family weekend of camping at nearby sites such as Shaver's Creek or Black Moshannon. Also, volunteer to take some children to recreational areas. These are excellent opportunities to teach our children about the creation stories.

• **G**REENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS - Eleven general agencies of The United Methodist Church are pledging to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 across ministries, facilities, operations, and investments. <u>The initiative was announced on Earth Day</u>. Net-zero emissions means the amount of human-produced greenhouse gas emissions does not exceed the amount taken out of the atmosphere, according to the <u>World Resources Institute</u>. Greenhouse gas removal is achieved by tactics such as restoring forests or <u>direct air capture</u> and storage. The agencies committed to the goal are the United Methodist Board of Church and Society, Board of Global Ministries, Board of Higher Education and Ministry, Commission on Archives and History, Commission on the Status and Role of Women, Communications, Council on Finance and Administration, Discipleship Ministries, United Methodist Men, United Methodist Women, and Wespath Benefits and Investments (From UM News, Jim Patterson).
