Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, the Healer of the Soul, and our Everlasting Redeemer. I am so excited about what the Lord has in store for us at Albright-Bethune. We have an amazing opportunity to be a bridge in the community by mending their souls with the word. Engaging their hearts in stewardship and prayer. Hello Family. I pray all is well with you and your family. As we engage in this Lenten season, we have several exciting activities to participate in and fellowship. Every Wednesday evening starting March 9 at 7 pm, we will have a midweek worship experience. We will be doing a joint 7 last words of Christ with Summerdale UMC. Pastor Bobby Jones, Jr., and Pastor Leah Williams will preach over the next weeks during Lent (more details are below). On the last evening of this Worship Experience, we will take an offering for the Preacher's Aid Society. Also, every morning during Lent, we will have a prayer and devotional time on Facebook Live with Pastor Paul starting at 7:30 am. We will also meet on March 11 and 25 (the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4th Fridays) for our Prayer Service at 7 pm in-person and on Zoom. On Easter Sunday, we will do a breaking the chain service. Each Sunday starting on March 6, everyone is encouraged to write a prayer of hope, grief, joy, the future, etc., on a strip of paper. We will wrap the chain around the church and on Easter Sunday we will do a ceremony of breaking the chains.

- Nothing But Nets Since 2006, the UMC has been fighting malaria as a founding partner of a group called *Nothing But Nets*. The UMC, the United Nations Foundation, and various partners have built this grassroots movement to end malaria and over 13 million bed nets have been sent to families in Africa. Just \$10 buys a bed net, distributes it to a family, and provides education on how to use it. The partners have raised over \$70 million. - **Services with Mennonite Church** Since 2000, Albright-Bethune and the University Mennonite Church have held joint worship services during Black History Month. This year our 22<sup>nd</sup> annual service was held on February 27 when the Mennonite Church joined our Albright-Bethune service. - Ash Wednesday On March 2, Albright-Bethune and Emmanuel Lutheran Church held a joint Ash Wednesday service. Pastor Paul McReynolds and Pastor Logan Wilmoth of Emmanuel led the service and Pastor Wilmoth also delivered the sermon. Jennifer Saunders served as the liturgist and Jason Adams provided the music for the service.

One hundred percent of all Advance contributions go to the designated cause. The UMC community in Ukraine, though quite small, is actively engaged in assisting neighbors in need. Global Ministries is in touch with the church's leadership as well as with church leaders in countries welcoming those who are fleeing from the violence (From UM Committee on Relief).

- Weaving Wisdom Conversations Three intergenerational conversations that are part of Grace Hampton's Gen2Gen national fellowship will be held at Albright-Bethune on March 18, April 8, and April 29 at 7 p.m. The three evenings of intergenerational conversation will feature art, music, and history around the theme of "Weaving Wisdom: Let's Talk About It!" Albright-Bethune has partnered with Dr. Hampton on a community-based project that seeks to expand interactions across the generations. She is a retired Penn State administrator and professor who is one of only 15 individuals who were selected to receive the Gen2Gen Innovation Fellowship for innovators who are bridging generational divides. Each year, the Encore Foundation selects practical visionaries who have new ideas for putting generational connection and collaboration front and center in ways that benefit all ages. Dr. Hampton is the Co-founder of the Weaving Wisdom: Fabrics and The Stories They Tell project which seeks to enrich relationships between generations and cultures through traditional fabric arts. She will use her \$10,000 fellowship to support "Weaving Wisdom" which is a community-focused project designed to use the communicative power of the arts to increase communication between older adults and younger individuals. The project uses Kente and Adinkra cloths, American guilts, and basketry to show how cultural values, social norms, heritage, and the history of nations, communities, and families can be transmitted between generations. - God's Trombones A production of James Weldon Johnson's God's Trombones with Essence 2 Ltd was presented on February 25 at Good Shepherd Catholic Church. Several individuals from Albright-Bethune participated in the production. Pastor McReynolds, AnneMarie Mingo, and Jason Adams had key roles in the production. Also, Jason Yates, one of our former worshippers who was our music director and vocalist, was featured during the production. Donations were collected to benefit the PA Innocence Project.
