From Pastor Paul's Desk......

- Nothing But Nets Since 2006, the UMC has been fighting malaria as a founding partner of a group called *Nothing But Nets*. The UMC, the United Nations Foundation, and various partners have built this grassroots movement to end malaria and over 13 million bed nets have been sent to families in Africa. Just \$10 buys a bed net, distributes it to a family, and provides education on how to use it. The partners have raised over \$70 million. - Recital On February 26, Daniel Spearman, our minister of music, had his recital as part of the requirements for his Master of Music degree at Penn State. Congratulations, Daniel. We are proud of your many accomplishments both here at Albright-Bethune and Penn State.
- EARTHQUAKES Over 50,000 were killed by the earthquakes that struck Turkey and Syria last month. And the humanitarian response struggled to meet the need among the devastation and winter weather. Fortunately, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) and its longstanding humanitarian partner, International Blue Crescent (IBC), has multiple offices and project sites in Turkey. In IBC offices, people filled the halls as they sought shelter, warmth, and a hot meal. With the devastating damage to roads, transport, and infrastructure, IBC has received hundreds of families in its Kilis Community Center for shelter, warm items, and hot meals. Kilis is serving as a major hub for coordination and relief efforts, including for cross-border response into Syria. Those who attended enjoyed an assortment of Mexican dishes. Special thanks to Ariel McReynolds for organizing and leading the dinner. Other fellowship opportunities for our women are being planned.
- Award Congratulations to **Dr. Chris Roser-Jones** who was recently named the recipient of the Jane M. Strickler, MD, Award, at Mount Nittany Health. Known for his exceptional commitment to his patients, colleagues, and staff, Dr. Jones earned this prestigious award by honoring the standards of innovation, excellence, and service set by Dr. Strickler. The award was established in 2001 to honor providers who improve the quality of healthcare and level of health of residents of central Pennsylvania. Chris is a cardiologist at Mount Nittany Health and one of our lifelong worshippers. We are indeed proud of your many accomplishments.
- Shares of Ministry Each congregation that is part of the United Methodist Church must pay an annual assessment that is called a shares of ministry. This assessment is used to support all churches that are affiliated with our UMC denomination. The assessment is largely based on the size of the congregation. Thanks to your generous support, in 2022 our congregation paid 100% of its assessment which was \$20,511. Our assessment included \$8,735 for Property and Casualty Insurance and Shares of Ministry for Benevolence (\$2,879), Connectional Ministries (\$4,284), and Clergy Support (\$4,613). - DISAFFILIATING CHURCHES A new report indicates that churches which are disaffiliating from The UMC are overwhelmingly in the South and Southwest and compared to remaining United Methodist churches are more likely to have a male pastor and a majority white membership. Those are among the findings of a new Lewis Center for Church Leadership report that looks at characteristics of departing and staying churches, based on 2019 statistics. Longstanding divisions in the UMC over LGBTQ inclusion led the 2019 General Conference to approve a temporary measure for local churches in the U.S. to gain release from the denomination's trust clause and leave with their property. Departing churches must meet certain financial requirements and have at least a two-thirds vote of members in favor of disaffiliation, as well as a majority approval vote from its annual conference (From UM News Article by Sam Hodges).

- UMC SCHOLARSHIPS & LOANS United Methodist Church high school seniors and those enrolled in college who are also active in their church and/or in the conference may apply for a Fall 2023 scholarship offered through the United Methodist General Board of Higher Education and Ministry. Students must apply online between December 15—March 30 at <a href="https://www.gbhem.org/loans-and-scholarships/scholarships">https://www.gbhem.org/loans-and-scholarships/scholarships</a>. Student loans are also available at low interest rates. Funds for these scholarships come from offerings taken on United Methodist Student Day, World Communion Sunday, and Native American Sunday.
