- BLACK METHODISTS FOR CHURCH RENEWAL The 56th General Meeting of the 'Black Methodists for Church Renewal (BMCR) was held April 12-15 in Pittsburgh. The theme for the meeting was Self-Realization: Knowing Our Purpose to Fuel Our Passion to Work Our Plan. Pastor Paul McReynolds participated in the meeting and our former Pastor (Rev. It is one of the UMC's five US-based ethnic caucuses. BMCR represents and is dedicated to more than 2,400 Black United Methodist congregations and approximately 500,000 African American members across the denomination.

- Mother's Day Greece gave birth to Mother's Day, but the mother of Mother's Day in the US was Ann Marie Reeves Jarvis, the wife of a West Virginia Methodist pastor. Her daughter, Anna, led a campaign to have Mother's Day become a national holiday. Anna heard her mother express hope that a memorial would be established for mothers, living and dead. After her father's death in 1902, Anna, her mother, and sister moved to Philadelphia. After Ann's death in 1905, Anna began a drive to fulfill her mother's wish. On May 10, 1908, a program was held at Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton and in Philadelphia, launching a memorial day for mothers. The church later observed Mother's Day on the 2nd Sunday each year making Andrews the mother church of Mother's Day. The church, no longer an active Methodist congregation, was incorporated as an international shrine in 1962. Mother's Day will be celebrated in 2023 on May 14 (From UM News Service).
- CLIMATE CHANGE Addressing climate change is a priority in Zimbabwe, and The UMC is among those looking for solutions. Tendai Rebecca Gurupira, who coordinates the United Methodist ministry with women, children and youth, recently accepted a \$3,000 grant from the ecumenical All Africa Conference of Churches to fund a joint tree-planting program alongside the United Church of Christ in Zimbabwe. Gurupira said that they bought 850 fruit tree saplings, 425 trees for each (denomination) to kickstart a tree-planting program. The beneficiaries of the program were children ages 4 to 16 years who were drawn from preschool and primary and high school classes. In addition, each teacher and congregant received a tree to plant at home. The Rev. - Ascension Day Did you know that, as promised, Jesus appeared to His disciples 40 days after his crucifixion? Christians traditionally celebrate His ascension into heaven on the 40th day of Easter (May 18 in 2023). This event is followed by the Day of Pentecost (May 28) to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit in whose power this happens.
- Survey of Black Clergy More than 650 Black clergy and laity from every jurisdiction in The UMC listed their top three concerns facing the future of the denomination: discrimination and racism, inequities in appointments and salaries, and lack of young adults in church leadership. They responded to a recent survey by the Gammon Research Institute, part of Gammon Theological Seminary, the UMC's only historically Black theological institution approved by the University Senate. The purpose of this new Gammon initiative, explained the Rev. Candace M. Lewis, is to amplify the voices of Black, Indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC) clergy leaders, sharing concerns, needs, opportunities, and stories of hope and resilience. For two years, Lewis has served as the first woman elected as president-dean of Gammon Theological Seminary. The institute strives to resource the past, present and future Black community by creating access to information and resources for equitable rectification (Extracted from UM News Article by Barbara Dunlap-Berg).

- Pentecost Pentecost is derived from the Greek word "pentekost" meaning 50^{th.} It is commemorative of the descent of the Holy Ghost on the apostles. It is held 50 days after Easter and 10 days after Christ's ascension. In 2023, Pentecost will be celebrated on May 28. The Jews also celebrated 50 days after Passover in a feast called Pentecost.
