• WORLD HUNGER SUNDAY - On November 19, congregations in our Susquehanna UMC Conference are asked to support World Hunger Sunday. Congregations are being asked to participate in the Harvest Home for World Hunger Offering. Half of the offering will be designated to assist food distribution programs within our conference. The other half will go to national and international UMCOR food programs. In 2021, the offering from congregations totaled \$30,412 and grants were distributed to 48 hunger programs.

• **V**EHICLES FOR BISHOPS - The recent purchase of sport utility vehicles is good news for bishops and United Methodists of the Congo Central Conference. The SUVs will facilitate mobility and allow bishops to carry out their pastoral responsibilities more effectively, even in the most difficult conditions. Financial support from the UMC Board of Global Ministries enabled the vehicles to be purchased and transported to their destinations. The Congo Central Conference includes four United Methodist episcopal areas covering six countries in central Africa (From Chadrack Tambwe Londe, UM News).

• **D**ISAFFILIATION LEGAL ACTIONS - The Oklahoma Supreme Court ruled that a judge had unlawfully interfered in the UMC's disaffiliation policies and ordered that she dismiss two congregations' lawsuits challenging those policies. <u>The state high court's two unanimous decisions</u>, released on Oct. 24, represent significant legal wins for the Oklahoma Conference. They also could have implications for other church-disaffiliation cases that have landed in U.S. civil courts. The two decisions detail the Oklahoma Supreme Court's reasoning for its October 5 order that a trial court "lacks subject matter jurisdiction" to hear cases involving the denomination's church-exit rules. The Oklahoma decisions came in the same month <u>a</u> <u>Pennsylvania judge denied a motion</u> filed by 11 UM churches seeking the court's immediate intervention to help them leave the Eastern Pennsylvania UMC Conference with property (From Heather Hahn, UM News).

• FALL OPTIONS - Try the following to make your transition to fall more enjoyable. Go outdoors to experience God's creation and watch the leaves change colors. Have a class outside, take a hike, go on a picnic, or pick-up litter in a park or along a roadside. Try a weekend of camping at nearby sites such as Shaver's Creek or Black Moshannon. Also, volunteer to take children to recreational areas. These are excellent opportunities to teach children about the creation stories in Genesis or other Biblical texts.

• **THANKSGIVING** – On November 23, we will celebrate Thanksgiving. Please use this time to live the purpose behind the day by helping a few friends, family members, students, and some worshippers. Several of our worshippers are from other states and countries and cannot return home for Thanksgiving. So, please include them in your big meal. One possibility is to deliver or have your guests pick-up the meal. Also, invite your guests to take some of the leftovers so they do not clog your freezer until Thanksgiving 2024.

• **P**LANNING FOR FINANCIAL LIFE EVENTS PROGRAM - Thanks to Cathy Bowen who secured a grant from the UMC Foundation to fund a program entitled "*Planning for Probable Financial Life Events*" that our church delivered. Session #1 was held on September 21 and titled *Estate Planning Essentials: Get Your Ducks in A Row Before It's Too Late.* Session #2 was held on October 12 and titled *Financial Missteps to Avoid or Be Aware Of.* Session #3 was held October 26 and titled *Aging and Caregiving Resources in Centre County. • **Stress Reducers** - With the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays approaching, now is a good time to reflect on an issue of A Christian Perspective newsletter that offered 7 ways to reduce stress and make your life more enjoyable. (1) Allow time everyday for privacy, quiet, and introspection. (2) When you face an unpleasant task, do it early in the day. (3) Delegate responsibility to capable individuals. (4) Take a lunch break to get away from your problems. (5) Count to 1,000 (not 10) before doing or saying something to make matters worse. (6) Have a forgiving view of events and people because we live in an imperfect world. (7) Have an optimistic outlook because most people do the best they can.

• ADVENT - How much do you know about Advent which celebrates Christ's birth 2,023 years ago? Advent is derived from the Latin word *Adventus* which means coming. It begins on Sunday, December 3, and ends at sunset on Christmas Eve. Advent always includes four Sundays. The 1st Sunday marks the start of the Christian year and the final victory. The 2nd and 3rd Sundays represent John the Baptist while the 4th represents events preceding Jesus' birth. Traditional colors include purple which means royalty and is linked to penitence and Mary, Jesus' mother. Blue represents hope and white and gold represent joy and festivity. Christmas Eve is not part of Advent, but is the beginning of Christmas.
