• **D**EATH - Alan Payne, one of our former worshippers, died September 11 at Mount Nittany Medical Center. On September 21, a viewing and visitation were held at Albright-Bethune before his funeral service. Thanks to everyone who assisted with the preparation and conduct of the service that Pastor McReynolds officiated. Alan worked at the Applied Research Lab (ARL) at Penn State for almost 40 years. He was also very active in the Forum on Black Affairs (FOBA) campus organization. Alan served as FOBA's president and was active on several committees. • FOUNDATION BOARD MEMBER - The United Methodist Foundation of Western Pennsylvania (Western Pennsylvania Annual Conference) and The United Methodist Stewardship Foundation (Susquehanna Annual Conference) have agreed to merge. **Cathy Bowen** has agreed to serve on the board of the newly formed foundation, effective October 1. An orientation meeting for this board was held September 29. The foundation's role will be to complement and reinforce the stewardship ministries of the UM churches, agencies, and programs primarily in Pennsylvania. • LAITY SUNDAY - Our congregation will celebrate Laity Sunday on October 17. On this day, members of the congregation will play increased roles in conducting our worship service. Laity Sunday is an invitation for the whole church to remember that all of the baptized, lay, and clergy together are the people of God. Our English word "laity" comes from the Greek word "laos" meaning, "people." Laity Sunday celebrates the ministry of *all* Christians to love God and neighbor

• **F**IRST AMERICANS MUSEUM - The Native American experience during and after colonization has been told before, often inaccurately. The <u>First Americans Museum</u> in Oklahoma City aims to get it right, at least the Oklahoma part. The \$175 million, 175,000-square-foot facility is an effort to cover the history of Oklahoma's 39 federally recognized tribes. Its grand opening on September 18-19 drew thousands to get a first look. The Rev. Chebon Kernell, a United Methodist elder and executive director of the denomination's <u>Native American Comprehensive</u> <u>Plan</u>, attended a groundbreaking for the museum more than 15 years ago. It has faced numerous delays, mostly around funding, through the years. His priority in being involved is "to ensure that the story is being told from the perspective of Native American/indigenous peoples. United Methodists from the <u>Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference</u> are involved with various facets of the museum (From article by Jim Patterson, UM News).

• **MPACT OF PANDEMIC -** Hartford (CT) Seminary has been awarded a five-year, \$5.3 million grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. to fund research into how congregations are changing, innovating, and establishing new ministry practices because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Hartford Institute for Religion Research will assist the Faith Communities Today project as it tracks the pandemic's effects on churches. United Methodist Communications, a member of Faith Communities Today, will be inviting United Methodist leaders and members to participate in the study (From the UM News Service - <u>Read press release</u>).

• VISIT BY NEW BISHOPS - On September 1, Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi and Bishop Sandra Steiner Ball began Episcopal oversight of the Susquehanna Conference. Both Bishops are excited to begin this new assignment as they replace Bishop Jeremiah Park who has retired. For the Bishops to begin to become acquainted with our Conference and its seven districts, there will be clergy/laity gatherings in each district. All clergy and laity are invited to attend one of the district gatherings. At least one of the bishops will be in person at each gathering. The gathering for our State College District will be held on October 16 from 2-4:30 pm at Mount Nittany UMC. The agenda has been planned by our Bishops and will include:

- Gathering worship and Renewal of Baptism
- Sharing of who each Bishop is (Their call stories, leadership styles, and hopes and dreams for the continuing the UMC)
- Facilitated conversation and sharing of the hopes and dreams of the gathered community
- The most critical things our new Bishops need to know about the district
- Q&A

These gatherings will not be live-streamed. However, there will be videos of the gatherings on the website after all have concluded. Because of the increase in the COVID variant, all participants will be expected to wear masks and social distance as much as possible. Registration is essential to make sure there is adequate space. • STRESS REDUCERS - With the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays approaching, now is a good time to reflect on an issue of A Christian Perspective newsletter that offered 7 ways to reduce stress and make your life more enjoyable. (1) Allow time everyday for privacy, quiet, and introspection. (2) When you face an unpleasant task, do it early in the day. (3) Delegate responsibility to capable individuals. (4) Take a lunch break to get away from your problems. (5) Count to 1,000 (not 10) before doing or saying something to make matters worse. (6) Have a forgiving view of events and people because we live in an imperfect world. (7) Have an optimistic outlook because most people do the best they can.

• **F**ALL OPTIONS - Try the following to make your transition from summer to fall more enjoyable. Go outdoors to experience God's creation and watch the leaves begin to change colors. Have a class outside, take a hike, go on a picnic, or pick-up litter in a park or along a roadside. Try a weekend of camping at nearby sites such as Shaver's Creek or Black Moshannon. Also, volunteer to take children to recreational areas. These are excellent opportunities to teach children about the creation stories in Genesis or other Biblical texts.

• **DEVOUT METHODIST** - Jackie Robinson, the baseball star who integrated Major League Baseball in 1947, was a devout Methodist. Robinson had a little-known ally helping him stay stoic and perform well through the fierce resistance he faced: his faith. "After a tense day at the ballpark, Robinson would head to his bedroom, get on his knees and pray for strength and courage," says his wife, Rachel Robinson. OVERVIEW & PURPOSE

OBJECTIVES

Jude 1:1b "To those who are called, wrapped in the love of God the Father and kept for Jesus Christ."

- Response In our debrief, we will engage each other by our response to the word in song, stories, and life learned lessons.
- Attitude When we engage each other, it will be done with respect, love, and kindness.
- Prayer Prayer is essential to who we are. It is our place of intimacy with God, the Father, our Savior, and the Holy Ghost. This is our foundation in all that we do.
