- ALBRIGHT-BETHUNE COOKS Discussions during our congregation's Wednesday night Zoom meeting have led to a new initiative for our church. We will expand our Men Who Cook concept and create a virtual Albright-Bethune Cooks. The concept is patterned after what Dylan Dreyer uses on the *Today Show* to teach her son (Cal) how to cook. Pastor Paul has agreed to do the filming, editing, and posting -- and teach others how to do it. We are planning for our episodes to be 5-10 minutes. Jo Ferrell has already created our first episode about her famous sticky buns. Our current thinking is to limit the episodes to our members, worshippers, and perhaps their relatives or close friends. - Targeted Food Bank Donation: Peanut Butter To concentrate our donations to the State College Food Bank, we are requesting that throughout the year we focus on donating peanut butter. During the months of July-March, peanut butter will be purchased and donated to the State College Food Bank on behalf of Albright-Bethune. Please help by contributing an additional donation (\$10 or whatever you can give) to the cause each month. Designate your donation for peanut butter/Food Bank on your paper check, electronic donation, or on the cash envelope you place in the collection plate. Peanut butter will be purchased and donated to the Food Bank on behalf of Albright-Bethune. By donating this way, the collective impact of our donations can be recorded in a more concise manner by the Food Bank and reported back to the congregation. This will also be helpful in completing yearly reports required by our Susquehanna UMC Conference and make the donations less work on individual members. During February and March, the peanut butter donations will be collected under our Peanut Butter Express Program and will be handled by our students.
- Bethune Society A group of students is attempting to create an organization at Penn State to work collaboratively with our congregation. Tentatively titled the Bethune Society, this organization will work closely with our church to plan, organize, and deliver various types of programs, projects, and activities. Zan Dyreson, a sophomore at Penn State and an Albright-Bethune member, is leading the effort to create the organization. The required minimum number of potential members has been identified and a draft constitution prepared. The required paperwork has been submitted for approval. - LAITY SUNDAY Our congregation will celebrate Laity Sunday on October 16. On this day, members of the congregation will play increased roles in our worship service. Laity Sunday is an invitation for the whole church to remember that all of the baptized, lay, and clergy together are the people of God. Our English word "laity" comes from the Greek word "laos" meaning, "people." Laity Sunday celebrates the ministry of *all* Christians to love God and neighbor.
- FOOTBALL PARKING During Penn State home football games this fall, our church is again making its parking spaces available to individuals attending the games. - Church Conference The Annual Albright-Bethune Church Conference will be held on November 13 at 2:30 pm at Mount Nittany UMC. - Summit & Retreat Postponed The Racial Ethnic Summit and Retreat that was scheduled to be held October 28-30 in Cincinnati will be rescheduled in 2023. This gathering is to enable UMC congregation leaders to make connections, build relationships, and gain practical insights to create or improve congregational vitality. In addition to clergy, others invited to participate include the SPRC chair, Administrative Board/Church Council chair, and Lay Leader from each racial-ethnic congregation or church served by a racial-ethnic pastor. Pastor Paul, Jackie Peagler, and Blannie Bowen will represent Albright-Bethune.
