- Racial Ethnic Summit The 2023 Racial Ethnic Summit was held September 22-24 at the Seven Springs Mountain Resort. Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi and Bishop Sandra Steiner Ball co-hosted this event with the UMC's Strengthening the Black Church for the 21st Century. In addition to clergy, the bishops invited the SPRC chair, Administrative Board/Church Council chair, and Lay Leader from each racial-ethnic congregation or church served by a racial-ethnic pastor. Jackie Peagler, the chair of our Administrative Council and our Pastor-Parish Relations Committee, and Blannie Bowen as Lay Leader, represented our congregation. They made several excellent connections and secured information and insights that will be incorporated into our congregation.

- New Quarter United Methodists and others gathered in San Antonio on September 14 to celebrate the minting of a US coin bearing the image of <u>Jovita Idár</u>, a Methodist, journalist, and activist who worked to empower Mexican American women and others in the early 20th century. The US Mint <u>included Idár</u> (1885-1946) as part of its American Women Quarters series. Other honorees include Eleanor Roosevelt, Maya Angelou, and Sally Ride. Representatives of the Mint joined members of Idár's family and retired UMC Bishop Joel Martinez in a <u>roundtable discussion</u> about Idár during the celebration at the University of Texas at San Antonio (From UM News Article by Robert Lopez and Austin Newton).
- Economic Impact of Rural Churches A new study suggests that there are many valuable things going on in rural churches and small congregations beyond Sunday morning worship. In North Carolina, a rural church contributes between \$488,598 to \$735,000 of value to its local economy each year, according to a new study from Partners for Sacred Places and the UNC Charlotte Urban Institute prepared for The Duke Endowment. Eighty-seven churches in North Carolina were surveyed for the study entitled "The Economic Halo Effect of Rural United Methodist Churches of North Carolina." In this study, "rural" was defined as "counties with a population density of less than 500 people-per-square-mile." Rural churches support local businesses and provide community meeting space, early childhood education and more. The economic contributions of rural churches suggest they should be measured by more than the length of their membership rolls (From UM News).
- Fall Options Try the following to make your transition from summer to fall more enjoyable. Go outdoors to experience God's creation and watch the leaves begin to change colors. Have a class outside, take a hike, go on a picnic, or pick-up litter in a park or along a roadside. Try a weekend of camping at nearby sites such as Shaver's Creek or Black Moshannon. Also, volunteer to take children to recreational areas. These are excellent opportunities to teach children about the creation stories in Genesis or other Biblical texts.

- **S**TRESS REDUCERS With the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays approaching, now is a good time to reflect on an issue of A Christian Perspective newsletter that offered 7 ways to reduce stress and make your life more enjoyable. (1) Allow time everyday for privacy, quiet, and introspection. (2) When you face an unpleasant task, do it early in the day. (3) Delegate responsibility to capable individuals. (4) Take a lunch break to get away from your problems. (5) Count to 1,000 (not 10) before doing or saying something to make matters worse. (6) Have a forgiving view of events and people because we live in an imperfect world. (7) Have an optimistic outlook because most people do the best they can.
