• **MOVE-IN DAY –** Many Penn State students moved back to their residence halls, apartments, and other residences on August 20-21. This year our church again helped welcome the students. Thanks to everyone who assisted and for those donated water and other items. In prior years, our worshippers have distributed water, helped individuals unload their vehicles in our parking lot, distributed literature about our church, and offered other types of support.

• VISIT BY NEW BISHOPS - On September 1, Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi and Bishop Sandra Steiner Ball began Episcopal oversight of the Susquehanna Conference. Both Bishops are excited to begin this new assignment as they replace Bishop Jeremiah Park who has retired. For the Bishops to begin to become acquainted with our Conference and its seven districts, there will be clergy/laity gatherings in each district. All clergy and laity are invited to attend one of the district gatherings. At least one of the bishops will be in person at each gathering. The gathering for our State College District will be held on October 16 from 2-4:30 pm at Mount Nittany UMC. The agenda has been planned by our Bishops and will include:

- Gathering worship and Renewal of Baptism
- Sharing of who each Bishop is (Their call stories, leadership styles, and hopes and dreams for the continuing the UMC)
- Facilitated conversation and sharing of the hopes and dreams of the gathered community
- The most critical things our new Bishops need to know about the district
- Q&A

These gatherings will not be live-streamed. However, there will be videos of the gatherings on the website after all have concluded. Because of the increase in the COVID variant, all participants will be expected to wear masks and social distance as much as possible. Registration is essential to make sure there is adequate space. • ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT – Our 2021 Susquehanna Annual Conference was held virtually on June 18-19. The theme for this year's Conference was *A Vision of the Beloved Community*. The full report from the Conference is now online. The conference featured various speakers, presentations, and worship activities. Bishop Jeremiah Park was honored as he retires. Also, several items of business and resolutions were discussed and voted upon. Also, various statistics were presented to compare 2019 and 2020 to show the impact that COVID-19 has had on the Conference. Membership stands at 133,312, down 3% from the previous year. Worship attendance stands at 34,646, down 29%. Church school attendance stands at 12,353, down 27%. Professions or reaffirmations of faith for 2020 were down 62%. ## Holy Club (HC): Hour of Power

Lesson Plan for Monday Night Live

#### **OVERVIEW & PURPOSE**

Pastor McReynolds is leading an experience at Albright-Bethune on Monday nights from 6-7 p.m. that will give students the opportunity to slow down for a moment and process their experiences thus far in the week. The group will be using the Holy Club Questions and given the opportunity to teach and lead this activity. Pastor McReynolds will do an 8-minute bible study or homily for our fellow community members. This experience will give us an opportunity to build a consistent prayer and bible study time while also engaging our peers and community with the Word of God.

#### OBJECTIVES

Jude 1:1b "To those who are called, wrapped in the love of God the Father and kept for Jesus Christ."

- Word The Word is central in what we do and how we will guide ourselves through the Journey of Life.
- Response In our debrief, we will engage each other by our response to the word in song, stories, and life learned lessons.
- Attitude When we engage each other, it will be done with respect, love, and kindness.
- Prayer Prayer is essential to who we are. It is our place of intimacy with God, the Father, our Savior, and the Holy Ghost. This is our foundation in all that we do.

• EACH ONE, BRING ONE! - Many individuals recently moved to the area when classes started at Penn State and in the schools. Also, several others have moved to the area to start new positions or be closer to their family and friends. Some of these individuals will seek a church home to have a fulfilling religious experience. • **G**ENERAL CONFERENCE - Whether the UMC's 2022 General Conference can go forward in Minneapolis next year from August 29-September 6 remains a question mark. With the more contagious delta variant of COVID surging around the globe, some governments are reinstating lockdowns, and many travel restrictions to the U.S. remain in place. The coming General Conference has 862 voting delegates and 56% come from the U.S. Almost 32% will come from Africa, 6% from the Philippines, 4.6% from Europe, and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to the UMC. Vaccination efforts also face a plenty of obstacles. However, organizers of the UMC's top lawmaking assembly continue to move forward with plans. The General Council on Finance and Administration board heard an update at its August 20 online meeting about the assembly (From an article by Heather Hahn of UM News).

For each quarter when at least \$5 in donations is generated, AmazonSmile will report to us the amount of donations generated for Albright-Bethune and that information will be reported in this newsletter. **Our collective impact can make a difference.** For example, suppose 15 people collectively spent \$5,000 on AmazonSmile purchase, that would generate \$25 in a donation to the church.
