- **B**ETHUNE SOCIETY A group of students is attempting to create an organization at Penn State to work collaboratively with our congregation. Tentatively titled the Bethune Society, this organization will work closely with our church to plan, organize, and deliver various types of programs, projects, and activities. Zan Dyreson, a sophomore at Penn State and an Albright-Bethune member, is leading the effort to create the organization. The required minimum number of potential members has been identified and a draft constitution prepared. The required paperwork has been submitted for approval. If approved, the Society will begin functioning this semester. See Zan if you have any questions.
- MEMORIAL SERVICE On August 27, a memorial service was held for Azalea and Albert Stevenson in New Orleans, their hometown. Azalea died on July 7 soon after she celebrated her 98th birthday. Albert died last year at age 97, just a month shy of his 98th birthday. They were active members of our church until their health began to decline. Cathy Bowen traveled to New Orleans to participate in the service which was streamed live and is now available on Mount Zion UMC's Facebook Live site. Cathy offered remarks on behalf of our congregation and shared personal reflections.
- Summit & Retreat A Racial Ethnic Summit and Retreat will be held October 28-30 at the Hilton Cincinnati Netherland Plaza. The primary purpose of this gathering is to enable UMC congregation leaders to make connections, build relationships, and gain practical insights to create or improve congregational vitality. In addition to clergy, others invited to participate include the SPRC chair, Administrative Board/Church Council chair, and Lay Leader from each racial-ethnic congregation or church served by a racial-ethnic pastor. Our Susquehanna Bishops Sandra L. Steiner Ball and Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi are co-hosting the event with the UMC's Strengthening the Black Church for the 21st Century initiative. Pastor Paul, Jackie Peagler, and Blannie Bowen will attend the summit and retreat to represent Albright-Bethune. See them if you have any questions about the meeting.
- ALBRIGHT-BETHUNE COOKS Discussions during our congregation's Wednesday night Zoom meeting have led to a new initiative for our church. We will expand our Men Who Cook concept and create a virtual Albright-Bethune Cooks. The concept is patterned after what Dylan Dreyer uses on the *Today Show* to teach her son (Cal) how to cook. Pastor Paul has agreed to do the filming, editing, and posting -- and teach others how to do it. We are planning for our episodes to be 5-10 minutes. Jo Ferrell has agreed to create our first episode on her famous sticky buns. Our current thinking is to limit the episodes to our members, worshippers, and perhaps their relatives or close friends. - Equipping Vital Congregations Meeting Thanks to everyone who participated in the August 23 Equipping Vital Congregations (EVC) meeting about the life of our congregation. Albright-Bethune has come to the midpoint in the 2-year partnership with the UMC's EVC initiative. This meeting was to check in and discuss the work that our congregation and its leadership have been doing. Pastor Paul and several of our worshippers shared their perspectives about the key accomplishments of our congregation. Three representatives of the EVC initiative; Brenda Leigey, our State College District Superintendent; and Rev. David Carter (Pastor Paul's mentor) also participated in the meeting. - Grant to Upgrade Bathrooms A United Methodist Foundation grant proposal that Cathy Bowen wrote has been funded for \$25,000 to support the remodeling of our basement social hall men's and women's restrooms. We will update them and make them accessible to individuals with physical limitations. A committee is seeking estimates from contractors and will appreciate suggestions. Before the work begins, plans will be shared with the congregation. The grant proposal included a matching amount (i.e., cost sharing) of funds from past and present members and attendees. - Pastor Salaries Two researchers say that UMC pastors should have their salaries set by annual conferences on a scale based on job performance and experience, which would reduce the salary disparity between Black and white clergy. Currently, local church leaders set pastor salaries based in part on the wealth of their church. The 12-year study, titled "Reproducing Inequality in a Formally Antiracist Organization: The Case of Racialized Career Pathways in the United Methodist Church," showed that the current system results in Black ministers being paid substantially less in North and South Carolina. The authors of the study are David Eagle, assistant research professor of global health at Duke University, and Collin Mueller, assistant professor of sociology at the University of Maryland. Eagle and Mueller also recommend that apportionments be used to spread the wealth among churches so that salaries are less connected to size, keeping in mind that current trends will lead to more small churches in need of leadership as time goes by (By Jim Patterson, UM News).

- EACH ONE, BRING ONE! Many individuals moved to the area when classes started at Penn State and in the schools. Some individuals will now seek a church home to have a fulfilling religious experience. Take the time to share your experiences and then bring one of these individuals to church with you. - Support for Ukraine The Poušť United Methodist church camp in the Czech Republic would normally have hosted children at camp this summer, but instead, it is serving as a home away from home for Ukrainian mothers and their children. Since early March, the camp has hosted about 19 guests who fled their homes after Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24. It is one of five United Methodist properties in the Czech Republic serving as a shelter for Ukrainian refugees. The Rev. Jana Křížova, coordinator of refugee ministries for the Czech and Slovak Republics Conference, said the refugee ministry happened naturally: "It's in the Methodist DNA. You see need and do something about it" (By Joey Butler, UM News).
